#### WINTER GREETINGS LITTLE CEDAR AND MARSHALL LUTHERAN CHURCHES!

Are you tired of winter yet? I mentioned in my Christmas morning sermon that I enjoy the quiet time of January. After the busy holiday season, it is good to slow down and find some rest. January is a time that I like to break out a puzzle or two...or several! January is also a good time for study and prayer. So, here we go! On January 12<sup>th</sup> we will start up a Bible Study on the prophesies of the Messiah!

The word Messiah comes from the Hebrew word "mashiah." Mashiah means the anointed one. The word shows up about 50 times in the Old Testament. Early in the Old Testament it often refers to a priest or a king. However, later on in the books of the prophet it begins referring to a messiah that comes from God through divine intervention. In the New Testament, Messiah is only used twice in the Gospel of John.

Next week we will jump into a Bible Study on the Messiah. Please join us on Thursday mornings at 10:00. I will also make study sheets available for you to work on your own. We will particularly look at the prophetic writings of the Old Testament that spoke of a coming Messiah and how the people at the time interpreted those writings and what that means for us today. For people that found themselves in times darkness and despair, the hope of a coming Messiah gave hope and comfort. Still today, that promise of a savior continues to give us hope!

The meeting was called to order by co-chair, Tracy. The Mission Statement was read in unison.

**Secretary's Report:** Motion by Spencer, seconded by Carol to accept the secretary's report as printed. Carried.

<u>Correspondence:</u> Thank you notes from several of our senior citizens who received poinsettias were read. Greetings from Barb Hoffert which included a donation to the church was read.

<u>Financial Report:</u> Millie reviewed the printed report. She reported that the drive through meatball meal profited \$6539, with one small bill left to pay. Luther Seminary sent a thank you for the ability to give a scholarship to seminar; y student, Mariah May, for a total of \$4898.88.
