

Matthew 13:10-17; 34-35

¹⁰Then the disciples came and asked him, "Why do you speak to them in parables?" ¹¹He answered, "To you it has been given to know the secrets of the kingdom of heaven, but to them it has not been given. ¹²For to those who have, more will be given, and they will have an abundance; but from those who have nothing, even what they have will be taken away. ¹³The reason I speak to them in parables is that 'seeing they do not perceive, and hearing they do not listen, nor do they understand.' ¹⁴With them indeed is fulfilled the prophecy of Isaiah that says:

'You will indeed listen, but never understand, and you will indeed look, but never perceive. ¹⁵For this people's heart has grown dull, and their ears are hard of hearing, and they have shut their eyes; so that they might not look with their eyes, and listen with their ears, and understand with their heart and turn and I would heal them.'

¹⁶But blessed are your eyes, for they see, and your ears, for they hear. ¹⁷Truly I tell you, many prophets and righteous people longed to see what you see, but did not see it, and to hear what you hear, but did not hear it.

³⁴Jesus told the crowds all these things in parables; without a parable he told them nothing. ³⁵This was to fulfill what had been spoken through the prophet:

"I will open my mouth to speak in parables;

I will proclaim what has been hidden from the foundation of the world."

Jesus' parables are always intriguing for folks. They are captivating, mysterious, and grounded in real life events. It is often debated why Jesus taught is parables so often. There are several places in scripture in which it says Jesus used parables to fulfill what was spoken through the prophets. It seems the biggest reason was because everyone likes a good story. It has been said that we are a storied people. We live by stories, we teach stories, and we learn by stories. This is probably why the parables are some of the best-remembered teachings of Jesus.

One of the things about parables is that they always leave people asking more questions than giving any answers. In so doing, it opens a person up to ask questions about God, and deepen an understanding of God. To those that explore the parables deeper and ask questions, find richness it what we can learn from those parables.

This June and July on Wednesday evenings we will venture into some of Jesus' Parables. It will be a wonderful time taking a closer look at the Parables. Our Wednesday services will begin June 10th at 7:00 each week. If you are able to, please join us as we explore the Parables!

The meeting was called to order by Gary Kulow. Pastor Jeremy lead us in a prayer. The Secretary's report from April was read. Minutes had to be revised from April. Total offering should have been \$3560 and cause of the month offering \$184.25. Jerry moved to correct the totals, Rhonda seconded and the motion passed. Julie gave the Financial Secretary's report with the total offering for the month of April being \$4574. Cause of the Month offering was \$295.25. Luvern gave the Treasurer's report. 
New Business:
