

The meeting was called to order by co-chair, John Jax. The Mission Statement was read in unison. Devotions were given by Chris Roser.

**Secretary's Report:** Motion by Carol, seconded by Spencer to accept the April minutes as corrected. Carried.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> Millie reviewed the report. Motion by Jan, seconded by Tracy to approve the treasurer's report as printed. Carried.

#### **Committee Reports:**

<u>Building</u>: A new toilet is needed in the south women's restroom. Schmitz Electric will take care of the installation.

<u>Daycare</u>: The Daycare has been getting COVID grants for the last several months. This helps the daycare work with parents who may not be working because of COVID, etc. There is full staffing for the summer months, but the daycare is advertising for an assistant beginning in the fall.
