
Greetings Marshall and Little Cedar Lutheran Churches!!



# **Our Detroit 2015 Blog**

Our trip started at 8:40am after packing the bus and a short blessing! We made a bathroom stop and a lunch stop before arriving in Racine, Wisconsin at Mt. Pleasant Lutheran Church (SpaceShip Church). This is a very neat church with many symbols that lead us to Jesus. We will tell you more about it at our Worship Service! Because it was so hot, we decided to head straight to our hotel in Grayslake, Illinois instead of doing any site-seeing. This way the kids could cool off and swim. We were at a Comfort Suites. It was a very nice room.

On Tuesday we were able to sleep in and enjoy the nice, hot breakfast that was provided. At 10am we headed out to Six Flags in Gurnee, Illinois. You can hear more about that at the Worship as well but we had a great time. We had 2 extra tickets so we did a Pay It Forward moment and gave them to people standing in line to buy tickets. One went to a family with a couple small children and one went to a teenage girl whose friends all had passes but she did not. It was fun to see them throughout the day enjoying their time at the park.

On Wednesday we got up and headed to Detroit. We stayed at a Comfort Inn in Farmington Hills. It was about 25 miles from Detroit. We got all checked in and organized and then went straight to Ford Field for our Opening. We missed a few of the opening acts even though we were not late. But we did not have good seats so we vowed to never get there later again. We heard from The Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton, Mikka McCracken and Dr. Luke A. Powery. We really liked the Bishop. She is quite funny! The House Band keeps things fun and exciting. After the Mass Gathering, we meet up with Duane (our wonderful bus driver) who takes us back to our hotel where we do our Final 15. Our focus was on Mark 16:1-8 The Resurrection of Jesus. We talked about being afraid in Detroit but also how we could Rise Up Together.

Thursday was our Proclaim Story day. Before we headed in to Cobo for our afternoon activities, we walked the RiverWalk to check out Canada. It was a beautiful morning for a stroll. In Proclaim Story, we gathered with our own synod to explore God's story and our stories. We worshiped together as we listened to and proclaimed the story that Jesus is....Good News. A local band from Rochester/Good Earth Village entertained us and kept us awake! We spread out to meet new people and worked on a timeline of "Our Story". After that we hung around Cobo for a little while before heading back to Ford Field for our evening Gathering. We heard music from Bobby Siegried, Blanca, Agape and Rachel Kurtz. Our speakers were Karis Ailabouni, Eric Barreto, Natasha T Miller and Alexia Salvatierra. I think Natasha the poet was our favorite! Our Final 15 was Mark 2:1-12 where Jesus heals a paralytic. We also talked about standing with the people of Detroit and helping them bear their burdens.

Friday was our Proclaim Community day. This gave us a little extra free time so we went to the Holocaust Museum in Farmington Hills and then on to the Motown Museum in Detroit. Both museums gave us a great look at all the things we were talking about. Breaking chains, bearing burdens, bringing hope and building bridges. It was an awesome correlation to the lessons of the week. We had lunch at a nice local restaurant that served Coney Island dogs. We had great service and were treated very well. We had been given a gift of money and were asked to do Pay It Forward opportunities. We saw this as a perfect opportunity to do this. We paid for 8 peoples meals and then gave the 4 waitresses extra tips above what the adults and students had given. Everyone was so appreciative. Some said it was the nicest thing that had happen to them and thanked us for coming to their city. After this we headed in to Cobo, a 11 football field size building that they call the Holy Playground! After a few hours here decorating our Bibles, praying for friends near and far and just having a fun time, we made the trek to Ford Field. Our speakers were Rani Abdulmasih, Sarah Funkhouser (from Minnesota!) and Steve Jerbi. Our entertainment was the Motown Experience! What a treat that was for everyone! The Temptations, The Miracles and more! Our Final 15 tonight was Mark 6:47-51 Jesus Walks on Water. We talked about not recognizing Jesus all the time but that he is there when you least expect it.

Saturday was our Proclaim Justice day. We had to be up early and to Hart Plaza by 8:45am. We were sent to Cass Industries where we scraped paint, repainted, worked in the Soup Kitchen, shredded paper and made mats out of recycled tires. It was a hot and exhausting day but it was very rewarding. We learned a lot about Detroit and how they are a city of differences but for them that is Normal! We got back early from our Justice day so we hung out at Cobo again for one last time to shop and play before our last walk to Ford Field. On our walk we took lots of group pictures (even though the kids complained it was hot!) and enjoyed our long walk one last time. Our musical entertainment was Rachel Kurtz, Agape, Trip Lee and of course, the awesome Skillet! Our speakers were Kyle Larson, Veronika Scott, Rozella White and Marian Wright Edelman. We loved hearing from Veronika and her Empowerment Plan. She is only in her 20's and has been named one of CNN's 10 Visionary Women in the World and was also named a 2015 Forbes 30 under 30 Social Entrepreneur for her Sleeping Bag Coats for the Homeless. Our Final 15 was Mark 15:33-39 The Death of Jesus. We were all pretty tired but it might have been our best night of discussion! We talked about breaking chains and how, when we go back home, we can serve God, see Jesus and use the chains to bind us together for good. Our faith in Jesus will help us break the chains (sin) that need to be broken.

Sunday was another early day as we wanted to be at Ford Field before 8:30am to get in and get our good seats that we have had all week (except Wednesday!). We listened to more great music and had a great worship service. It was fun to see Bishop Eaton dancing around the altar and watching the dancers dance while holding communion! We shared offering and communion together—all 30,000 of us. It was quite the experience.

We were all pretty tired on the way home but there was not as much sleeping as I thought. We had a great trip and am already making plans for Houston in 2018.

Thank you so much to all the students and chaperones for making the trip so great. Thanks so much also to all of you back home who prayed for us, donated money or items. We could not do this without such a caring church and community. It is a trip we will all remember for a lifetime.


### New Business:
