I must admit that hope is a bit difficult to grasp and explain. You can buy whole books that try to explain hope. Hope is a tricky business. Some people seem to just naturally have it all the time. Others need to work at it. Sometimes hope seems to be overflowing, and other times you can't find it no matter how hard you try.

You never know when and how it comes to us. Sometimes it might surprise you. You may be sitting all tired from your life, and a single genuine caring word from a complete stranger may become hope for you. It may be in the kind gestures, a good deed, a gentle song. Ironically it may also be in the worst of times as well. It may emerge from within yourself when you begin to give up.

No matter where hope comes from it is that which pushes us forward in our day. Hope is what sends a farmer into the field, a student to school, and a parent off to work. Meeting was called to order by Len Mensink, President.

Pastor Jeremy updates:

- •Pastor discussed with council his allotted 4 Sundays off per year. Currently he has used 2 and will take the Sunday after Christmas off. One remaining Sunday with undetermined use and may carry to next year.
- •Discussed with group, should there be a need, for Pastor to quarantine or in the event that he should get COVID.

 oGroup is realistic regarding risk of future exposure and /or illness and agrees that YouTube video would work. There is an understanding the pulpit supply is generally unavailable at this time due to COVID.
- •Sunday Worship Discussion: If Southland school district closes group agrees that there would be no in-person worship services; YouTube or other would be used.
- •Confirmation—"normal" sessions, including dinner, to be held with 6,7,8th graders for two weeks. Beginning 10/21 Southland will use Weds. as a "flex day" having no students on school grounds. With this in mind, after 10/21, evening Confirmation Sessions will continue as usual but there will be no evening meal.
- •Religious release will be held, during the school day, on Thursdays, for elementary students only. As noted above, school will be closed on Weds.. Release for Jr./Sr. High will be reevaluated after the Christmas break as this student population is considered high risk.

Secretary's and financial/treasurer's reports were reviewed.

- Total offering for September \$2,185.00/\$72.00 COM—Socks in the City
- •October Cause of the Month offering will be for Lutheran World Relief.

Motion to accept reports from Donna with second from Gary. Motion carried.

Old Business:

- •Donna informs that Denny Freund will be in the area and will stop at the church to take a look at needed repairs. Donna to contact Len or Dale if there is an immediate need for funds.
- •Len will contact Darin Boe to request that he further investigate possible plugged tile line in the cemetery. Acknowledge that cost will be incurred as digging, with heavy equipment, will be needed.
- Personnel/Finance Committees: Carie will continue to attend as needed.

New Business:

- ► Communion—wine and /or bread will be determined by number of attendees during services. Higher numbers make offering wine more difficult. Note that folks may struggle with cane/walker use and removal of mask to receive wine.
- ► Group discussed fall pumpkin hunt and auction. Len will reach out to Kathi H. and Julie Hanson regarding pumpkin hunt.

Group proposes this take place on church grounds, eliminating hay ride and communal lunch. Auction may be possible depending on Terry Hamilton's availability. Options to be considered—is it possible to do outside, etc.?

Update from conversation with St. John's Lutheran/Elkton. As their Pastor resigned this summer, they are currently in the process of discemment & self study for their pastoral and ministry needs. As part of this process, they've sent letters and will be having conversation with surrounding churches to inquire about the possibility of sharing responsibilities. If needed there will additional conversations for input from councils and perhaps congregations.
