

APPROVAL of COUNCIL MINUTES: A <u>motion</u> by Rod Nordeng, <u>seconded</u> by Mary Schmitz to approve the secretary's minutes, for February, as printed. <u>Motion carried</u>.

CORRESPONDENCE/RECOGNITION of VISITORS: Pat Hinz reported the following:

- A. A conference on bullying will be held on April 14, 2013, at St. John's Lutheran Church in Kasson. If anyone is interested in going they can check the information on the bulletin board.
- B. Letter was received on insurance comparisons. The letter will be kept on file.
- C. Luther Seminary event, May 9, 2013 with a dinner/reception. Pat read a thank you note Dave and Millie Weness received from a student who was recipient of scholarship money from Little Cedar.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Jaymie reported a general fund balance of -\$9,644.97 and daycare balance of \$8219. Discussion followed. A motion by Gordy Briggs, seconded by Rod Nordeng to approve the treasurer's report as presented. Motion carried.

- A. <u>Building</u>: Pat Hinz reported on the leak in the church roof. She spoke to Bill Klingerman about it. The building committee will be looking into this.
- B. <u>Cemetery</u>: no report
- C. <u>Daycare:</u> Linda Gilles and Karen Anderson reported that the committee selected 4 Southland seniors, one to be selected by the high school scholarship committee to receive the Daycare Scholarship this May. Also, the doors have been replaced on the counter/cupboard in the daycare room.

- D. Finance: no report
- E. <u>Life/Missions</u>: Mary Schmitz reporting. The Seder meal brought in a free will offering of \$237. This will be used to help pay for the food and supplies (\$285). The remaining \$48, the \$50 for lodging at the Rose Pedaler, and \$75 gas money will be shared by Marshall. A <u>motion</u> by Rod Nordeng, seconded by Karen Anderson to approve paying gas money for the Rabbi who presented the Seder service. Motion carried.
- F. Personnel: Gordy Briggs reported that they met with Pastor Natacha for the Pastor review.
- G. <u>Youth/Education</u>: Tricia Milks reported there will be VBS this summer and discussion was held in their committee to find ways to get the Jr. High students more involved, and a survey for parents is being sent out about programs and getting kids more involved.
- H. <u>Worship/Music:</u> Pat Hinz reported that the Good Friday service will be a presentation of the Stations of the Cross, will use the service Listen God is Calling for April and May, and WOV service of Word and Prayer for the summer months.

PASTOR'S REPORT: Pastor Natacha thanked all who were involved in helping with the Seder Meal, thought it went well. She also reported that she will be taking vacation time either at the end of April or in May. She will line up pulpit supply for the time she is gone.

My Plans for the Future

So about those future plans...

I have appreciated the insights and suggestions that many of you have shared with me as I approach the end of my call as bishop. I have also shared conversation with the staff concerning this approaching transition. Together we have done reading that reminds us that endings are opportunities for beginnings as well.

I am anticipating such a new beginning. Lynette and I have spent a lot of intentional time discussing what the future might hold. I don't feel ready to retire. I am still

healthy, and am reminded that I might still have 1/3 of my life remaining. I love being part of this church, and feel I still have gifts to offer. I spent 28 years in parish ministry. Now I conclude 12 years in the office of bishop. I have enjoyed viewing the church from different perspectives. Such opportunities excite me.

For that reason, I have accepted a call to serve the church in still a different position. I will join the leader-ship team of Portico Benefit Services beginning October 1, 2013, as Assistant to the President for Church Relations. I will work out of the Portico office in Minneapolis. A major part of my responsibilities will be building and strengthening relationships with the ELCA, as well as bringing the perspective of the church to Portico. It will include an ongoing relationship with the Conference of Bishops. The coming years also promise to be a time of challenge because of the changes forecast in health care. I will have the opportunity to meet with leaders and organizations throughout the church as we seek to interpret these changes, and provide for the well-being of those who serve.

Until then, there remains important ministry to be done right here in the Southeastern Minnesota Synod. That continues to excite me as well.
