



1 Corinthians 12: 4-13

<sup>4</sup>There are different kinds of gifts, but the same Spirit. <sup>5</sup>There are different kinds of service, but the same Lord. <sup>6</sup>There are different kinds of working, but the same God works all of them in all men. <sup>7</sup>Now to each one the manifestation of the Spirit is given for the common good. <sup>8</sup>To one there is given through the Spirit the message of wisdom, to another the message of knowledge by means of the same Spirit, <sup>9</sup>to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by that one Spirit, <sup>10</sup>to another miraculous powers, to another

prophecy, to another distinguishing between spirits, to another speaking in different kinds of tongues, and to still another the interpretation of tongues. <sup>11</sup>All these are the work of one and the same Spirit, and he gives them to each one, just as he determines. <sup>12</sup>The body is a unit, though it is made up of many parts; and though all its parts are many, they form one body. So it is with Christ. <sup>13</sup>For we were all baptized by one Spirit into one body--whether Jews or Greeks, slave or free--and we were all given the one Spirit to drink. 14 Now the body is not made up of one part but of many.

We are each given different gifts to work in church. We are each called to work in the church in a variety of ways, with no one gift is better than another. There are many parts, but they form one body; the body of Christ.



Rainbow Ringers: We missed Rainbow Ringers **Ringers** last year so we are hoping to start back up again at the end of October.





## Marshall Church Council Meeting Minutes

## August 14, 2013

Marshall Church council met for its regular meeting August 14, 2013. Date changed due to county fair. Present: Pastor Jeremy Johnson, Dale Himebaugh, Darrell Gordon, Brenda Hanson, Andrew Sprau, Rhonda Hatle, Carie Hanson, Luvern Hanson, and Cathy Sprau. Absent: Jerry Sprau, Gib Seimers and Gary Kulow.

Chairman Dale Himebaugh called the meeting to order.

Devotions and prayer was given by Pastor Jeremy. He talked about the mission of the church.

Pastor's report was given. Pastor Jeremy continues to visit the shut-ins. He is conducting a worship service at the Adams Health Care Center once a month at present. Starting in September he will be doing this twice a month. Over 60 children attended Vacation Bible School and was enjoyed by all. September 8, 2013 is Rally Sunday and also blessing of school backpacks. A churchwide assembly was held recently with the election of a new bishop, Elizabeth Eaton of the NE Ohio Synod. She replaces Mark Hanson.

Secretary's report was given for the month of July. Financial secretary's report was given by Carie Hanson. Total offerings for the month of July was \$4,087.40. Cause of the month, Southland Foodshelf, was \$196.40. Total offerings thus far for 2013 is \$28,364.17. It was noted that we are about \$1700 behind last year at this time. Treasurer's report was given by Luvern Hanson. Reviewed expenses. The outside carpet for the steps have been paid for with a total of \$816.20 including installation. A motion by Andrew Sprau to accept reports. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Darrell Gordon. Motion carried.

Old Business: The installation of new carpet for the outside steps has been completed.

Sealant has been placed on the blacktop in the parking lot and to the corner of the road.

Continued with discussion of options for replacing church's roof.

Handicap bars have been placed in the bathroom per request.

Luvern Hanson reported that he has contracted LP fuel for the upcoming season at \$1.35 per gallon.

Continued discussion on ideas for the use of designated memorial funds.

**New Business:** Pastor Jeremy shared that September 8, 2013 is the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the ELCA. A service project was recommended by churches. Little Cedar is planning to do some clean-up projects at the Adams Park on September 8<sup>th</sup>. They have asked Marshall to join them and suggested a picnic to follow.

Dale Himebaugh noted that Marshall Church is in need of a work day. This would include some clean-up work for the church, grounds and cemetery. A motion by Rhonda Hatle to have a work day at Marshall, Saturday, September 7, beginning at 1:00 PM. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Brenda Hanson. Motion carried.

The Little Cedar Lutheran Church Council met on Wednesday, July 24, 2013 @7:30pm. Absent: Rod Nordeng. The meeting was called to order by Chair Pat Hinz.

### DEVOTIONS/PRAYER: Linda Gilles

**APPROVAL of COUNCIL MINUTES**: A <u>motion</u> was made by Becky Hartwig, <u>seconded</u> by Tracy Smith to approve the secretary's minutes for June, as printed. <u>Motion carried</u>.

#### CORRESPONDENCE/RECOGNITION of VISITORS:

A. Good Earth Village Quilt Auction: notice will be posted on the church bulletin board and in the Churchmouse. It is Saturday, August 17<sup>th</sup>.

B. Kids Against Hunger: thank you was received for the \$50.00 gift sent.

C. Farewell for Bishop Usgaard: information will be posted on the church bulletin board and in the Churchmouse. It is Thursday, August 22<sup>nd</sup>, in Rochester. Cost is \$25.00.

**TREASURER'S REPORT**: Jaymie reported a General Fund balance of -\$14,885.90. Discussion followed. A motion was made by Maynard Lewison, <u>seconded</u> by Mary Schmitz to approve the treasurer's report as presented. <u>Motion carried</u>. A note will be put in the bulletin to thank members for their response towards meeting our financial goals.

#### COMMITTEE REPORTS:

A. <u>Building</u>: Maynard reported that the emergency lights were replaced and a timer for the lights installed at a cost of \$1532.00. A bid was received from Nelson's, of Austin, to sealcoat and fill the cracks in the parking lot, for \$7600.00. Maynard will look into snow removal of the parking lot, now that Osmundson Bros. will no longer be doing it. Joe Matheis reported on the free energy audit by Alliant and the suggestions made that can be a savings to the church.

B. <u>Cemetery</u>: Tracy Smith reported no meeting but that 2 trees had been planted by the Thalberg and Gordon families, who are taking care of them. The committee plans to put together a final plan for planting more trees. They will also look into the issue with the road at the cemetery.

- D. <u>Finance</u>: Jaymie discussed the different funds of the church.
- E. Life & Missions: no report
- F. <u>Personnel</u>: no report



G. <u>Youth & Education</u>: Tricia Milks spoke with Tara Mandt and reported that 60 kids will participate in VBS this year along with 21 adults and students helping. There were 8 youth and 4 adults that attended the Sonshine Festival in Wilmar.

H. <u>Worship & Music</u>: no meeting. Pat reported that the committee will meet at 6:45 pm, prior to the August council meeting. It will be opened up to anyone else on the council or congregation who would like to attend, to choose hymns to be sung at worship services. They would like to try and do this quarterly.

**PASTOR'S REPORT**: Pastor Jeremy reported that he continues with services at the AHCC and may do a service there every other week, depending on scheduling at the AHCC. He would like to see a stewardship campaign either this fall or next spring and spoke of 2 books he has that speak of the mission of the church and invited anyone who wished to read these and have a conversation on this, to contact him.



#### OUTSTANDING BUSINESS:

A. Memorial Day Lunch: Pat asked Becky Hartwig, from Life & Missions committee, to contact Marlene Hanson, in charge of the service groups, to see how these groups would feel about doing this lunch.

## An Introduction to Bishop Steven Delzer

The first of September, 2013, marks the beginning of the term for the new bishop of the Southeastern Minnesota Synod, ELCA. Rev. Steven (Steve) Delzer was elected by the Synod Assembly on June 8 on the fifth ballot (more on the process at semnsynod.org/how-do-we-elect-a-bishop).

"I am deeply humbled at being elected. My prayer is that the Spirit will guide us, so that together our eyes and ears may always be open to the ways in which we may be the body of Christ in the world," said Delzer.

At the time of election, he served as lead pastor of Our Savior's Lutheran Church, Faribault, Minn., a call that began in 2002.

His ministry in this synod has included facilitating the monthly meeting of interim pastors and conducting initial interviews of those desiring to enter candidacy for rostered ministry in the ELCA.

Our Savior's, Faribault, was the first site of a Sudanese ministry in this synod. Delzer helped their ministry develop and served as mentor to their leader, Wal Reat, as he journied through the TEEM (Theological Education for Emerging Ministries) program. Reat was ordained in March 2013.

Rev. Delzer previously served as an interim pastor at Zion Lutheran Church, West Union, Iowa and First Lutheran Church, Albert Lea, Minn. Prior to 2000, he served congregations of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod in Maryland, Missouri, and Minnesota.

He earned an Associate of Arts degree from Concordia College (now University) in St. Paul, Minn., in 1969; a Bachelor of Arts degree from Concordia Senior College (now Concordia Theological Seminary) in Fort Wayne, Ind., in 1971; and a Master of Divinity degree from Christ Seminary–Seminex in 1975.

Steve and his wife Donita live in Faribault. They have three adult children and five grandchildren.

If you have not had occasion to meet Steve as a pastor, you may have seen him running past you or out on the golf course. He believes in living a healthy life and modeling it for others. He stays active in tennis, biking, golf, and running (including seven marathons, six half-marathons,

and three relay marathons over the last twelve years). Steve also nurtures his well-being through devotion time, reading, and several collegial and support groups.

Rev. Delzer has spent the summer finishing his call in Faribault and preparing for his new call as bishop. As he looks ahead to his call to bishop, he says, "I am looking forward to becoming better acquainted with the pastors and congregations of the synod, getting to know other bishops, and learning more about the wider church."

At the same time, he acknowledges the challenges of the role. He hopes to be able to do the job well and continue living a balanced life and modeling it for the rest of the synod.

How can you help as the synod prepares for this transition? He asks that members of the synod be willing to share their gifts and abilities for the good of ministry in southeastern Minnesota. Most of all, though, Delzer requests, "Pray for me." He adds, "I never would have been willing to accept this call without knowing the spirit is leading and people are praying."

## About Our Synod

The Southeastern Minnesota Synod is a faith community of 124,000 baptized people in 176 congregations as well as related institutions of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). Its geographic area includes 15 counties in the southeastern corner of Minnesota.
